




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A Message from our Group Chief Executive



Leading change and doing things differently

It's my very great pleasure to write the foreword to the Summer 2016 edition of Choice News. I'm now just over six months into my role as Chief Executive of Choice. Even in this relatively short period of time, much has changed – and continues to change – in both the local economy, and within Choice as we seek to anticipate current and prospective tenant needs.

Whilst recent news is dominated by the implications of the 'Brexit' referendum, the draft NI Programme for Government is still out for consultation. This blueprint for the next Assembly term will have a significant impact on all of us, and Choice has taken the opportunity to provide our views on how and where priorities could be enhanced. More specifically, I believe that access to a good quality and affordable home should be a fundamental right for everyone across Northern Ireland. We have also highlighted to our new Minister, the importance of sheltered and supported housing as an investment that delivers 'downstream' savings and enhanced benefits for the most vulnerable sections of our society. Finally, we would encourage the NI Executive to prioritise the building of a shared society, rather than merely increasing shared space.

The potential challenges around ongoing welfare reform are well documented, and you should be assured that Choice will play its part in helping tenants to prepare for the changes already signalled. However, the level of detail around timelines and revised welfare procedures is still quite limited, and I would not be surprised if additional proposals emerge in the Autumn budget statement. At Choice and across the Housing Association movement, we believe that our 'profit for a purpose' social enterprise model continues to make a significant contribution to the socio-economic prosperity of Northern Ireland. We look forward to continuing to work closely with our public, private and third sector partners to deliver great homes and thriving communities.

Within Choice, we are progressing a range of improvement initiatives under the heading of 'Leading Change'. This year our board have set a number of stretching targets one of which is to deliver over 400 new homes and the allocation over £100,000 of funding to deliver a range of social projects that help us build stronger inclusive communities. Maintaining our housing stock to the highest standards remains a key priority and this year we will invest over £24millon pounds in a range of kitchen, bathroom, heating and planned upgrades to our properties.

We have recently made a number of revisions to our departmental structures to bring all of our customer services – including housing management,

response repairs and the customer contact centre – within one Directorate. We are also reviewing the current customer 'journey' to ensure a seamless and integrated delivery structure and ultimately enhance tenant satisfaction. In an era of austerity for all, it is also critically important that we make best use of our charitable assets and limited resources to

ensure that we continue to build and maintain high quality, energy efficient and affordable homes for all. Our voluntary board has therefore just approved a new 'Value for Money' strategy, and our tenant forums will work closely with senior management and colleagues to provide a renewed focus on the impact of everything that we do.

I'd like to conclude by thanking everyone who returned a customer satisfaction survey. We have so much to do not only to improve our current services but to expand these services to meet your needs – and your views are crucial.

I hope that you have a great summer and thanks for choosing Choice as your landlord.

European Investment Bank confirms £150 million for Choice Housing

The European Investment Bank (EIB) will provide a £150m for Choice social housing in Northern Ireland.

Apex housing association also received EIB approval for £130m loan. The long-term loans mark the Bank's first direct engagement with Housing Associations in Northern Ireland and will lower the cost of borrowing. We will now join a shortlist of high performing associations in the UK and Ireland that have met the EIB's requirements for credit approval.

The funding, alongside statutory support from the Department for Communities, will enable Choice to begin construction on 2,700 new social homes over the next five years and retro-fit of many existing units.

Jonathan Taylor, European Investment Bank Vice President said: "The European Investment Bank has a firm commitment to supporting new investment in social and affordable housing across the UK that represents nearly half of overall EIB backing for social housing in Europe. I am pleased to be in Belfast today to confirm our largest ever support for social housing investment in Northern Ireland with Choice. The overall investment that will improve lives, create jobs, benefit local suppliers and cut heating bills in homes across Northern Ireland."

Michael McDonnell, Chief Executive of Choice Housing said: "This investment package demonstrates confidence in our ability to deliver high quality outcomes and gives us access to the most costeffective long-term finance arrangements ever used in Northern Ireland. Ultimately that means we can make public money go further and put more social homes in the areas where they are needed most. As a social enterprise, we direct our resources and commercial ambition towards long-term opportunities that can deliver more for the communities we serve. This is a great result for us, EIB and for the region."

Paul Givan MLA, Minister for Communities, welcomed the investment: "This funding shows the confidence that the European Investment Bank has in the work of local housing associations and is a clear indication that social housing is a strong market which continues to deliver. My Department already provides significant funding for social housing and this combination of public and private financing will enable Choice Housing to build more social housing for those in most need across Northern Ireland."

The new EIB support was formally announced during a site visit by Jonathan Taylor, Vice President of the European Investment Bank to a new Choice Housing development in Greenisland.

Choice delivers boost for Clean and Green Community Scheme



One of the largest grant schemes aimed at improving urban environments in Northern Ireland today secured a £60,000 boost from Choice Housing



Ian Humphreys, Chief Executive at Keep Northern Ireland Beautiful, says: "These small grants support voluntary practical action where people want to grow a strong 'can-do' community spirit. It is exciting to see the grant scheme growing with the seven councils, Department of Agricultural, Enviromental and Rural Affairs (DAERA) and Tourism NI now joined by Choice Housing and Coca Cola. This simply means more money reaching the places and people whose ambition is to bring about positive change where they live."

Northern Ireland Fire & Rescue Service Smoke Alarm Safety

Northern Ireland Fire & Rescue Service (NIFRS) is reminding people to be 'Fire Safe' at home as tragically 28 people have died as a result of accidental house fires in the past three years.

NIFRS Assistant Chief Fire Officer Alan Walmsley said: "Every house should have a working smoke alarm fitted on each floor. By taking a few lifesaving minutes to check your smoke alarm once a week, you are keeping yourself and your family safe from the dangers of fire. Every household should have a fire escape plan and everyone in the house should know what to do in the event of a fire. You should 'get out, stay out and get the Fire & Rescue Service out'.

"By following our simple fire safety advice you will greatly reduce your risk of fire in the home.

"If you are concerned about the fire safety of a family member or neighbour then you can contact NIFRS via our website and fill in the Home Fire Safety Check referral form – www.nifrs.org. 
Choice are pleased to announce the launch of our new website, designed with a fresh new look, userfriendly navigation and updated with the latest information about our range of housing and services.

Get Everyone Online

New pilot programme to develop digital skills

The Get Everyone Online programme, available to all tenants in Knockagh Court and Victoria Court, is coordinated in partnership with e-learning specialist Digital Unite through its influential Digital Champions Network. You can download the Get Everyone Online booklet to find out further information from our website www.choice-housing.org.

The initiative will train a number of volunteers who will work with residents to build their confidence and ability to log on and become digitally active. If you are interested in volunteering as a Digital Champion you can download the Become a Digital Champion booklet from our website www.choice-housing.org.

Technology makes it easier and quicker for people with even a basic level of skill to access services and information online that can save time and money while creating a more connected and better-informed society.

The friendly support and guidance from well-trained Digital Champions will assist those with little or no experience of computers to take their first steps online and address almost any question – no matter how big or small.

For those interested in becoming a Digital Champion, the programme includes easy-to-follow online courses that outline the fundamentals of helping and inspiring new learners. The courses are also linked to the national Open Badge scheme for professional verification and all Digital Champion activity is tracked and evaluated.

This engenders pride in our homes and neighbourhoods. Choice are committed to working in partnership with our customers, local authorities and voluntary bodies to ensure the homes we provide meet the needs and expectations of our customers.

We would ask all our residents to make every effort to prevent rubbish from building up at their home. We would also encourage everyone to make full use of the recycling options provided by Choice and the local councils.

Talking Rubbish!

Here is some useful information on how to manage your waste disposal.

In flats and apartment blocks, it is important that you keep shared areas clean and tidy of rubbish and avoid cluttering them with things like toys, furniture, bicycles and prams. These are escape routes and if there is a fire and they are blocked, it could make evacuating the building quickly and safely more difficult.



If you live in a street property you will have at least a wheelie bin. If you live in a block, there are communal bins for your rubbish. We ask all our residents to dispose of their rubbish and waste responsibly and for you to consider your neighbours.

If you have wheelie bins, put them out for collection on the right day. Put it away as soon as possible after it is emptied and we recommend that you put an identification mark on your bin so you know which are your bins e.g. your house number.

If your bins tip over and rubbish is on the street, bin store area or garden – please take responsibility for it and clear the rubbish.

If you have recycling bins please use the correct bin for the waste eg. garden waste for the garden bin.


Large or heavy items, such as furniture and white goods, cannot be taken on normal bin collection rounds. However, most councils offer to collect these items from your home or you can take them to a Bulky Household Waste Site. Please contact your local council to find out more.

Items such as good quality furniture or other household items, can often be recycled or re-used by local charities

County Down housing scheme named among UK's top eco-friendly developments

An ultra-energy efficient Choice Housing scheme in County Down has been named on a shortlist of the UK's most environmentally friendly developments.

Killynure Green in Carryduff, which is classed as 'zero carbon', impressed a slew of international judges to secure a rare nomination at the prestigious Green Apple Environment Awards, which take place in August. Established in 1994, the annual awards recognise, reward and promote environmental best practice.

Completed last year, the 40-unit social housing development employs a range of cutting-edge renewable technologies that recycle water and solar power and help tenants reduce costly energy usage. The ground-breaking scheme was the first in Northern Ireland to achieve the highest grading possible for sustainable homes – meeting strict targets for CO² emissions, water usage, ecology and waste – and remains one of the largest of its kind in the UK.

Michael McDonnell, Chief Executive of Choice said: "It's hugely rewarding to be told by anyone that you are among the best, but it means more when you're judged against peers and by experts who understand exceptional quality and the challenges of achieving excellence. Killynure Green is a unique development in Northern Ireland and has been designed to show how we can set and achieve the highest possible standards for customers.

"The recognition of our work has galvanised our team and our customers who share in our efforts and rewards. We are excited to be named among the very best construction projects in the UK and hope to bring home good news in August." Earlier this year, Killynure Green claimed the coveted Best Social Housing Project title at the Royal Society of Ulster Architects (RSUA) awards, the Chartered Institute of Housing's Sustainable Development Award and also claimed an Action Renewable award in recognition of excellence in planning.

- Tenants living in sheltered housing schemes should continue to report all cases of ASB directly to their Scheme Co-ordinators or to the Services Centre on **0300 111 2211**, during normal office hours.
- Insec Security will only visit the person who is causing the ASB.
 Insec will not visit the tenant making the complaint. This process is to ensure confidentiality is maintained.

Delivering New Homes

Our Development Team are working on new housing schemes to deliver much needed homes across Northern Ireland.

Much Needed Family Homes for North Belfast

Choice have successfully delivered six new homes to families in Ainsworth Avenue, Belfast in May, 2016. The new homes are a mixture of two and three bedroom houses and will add to our existing housing stock in the area. The new housing cost £640,000 and took approx 13 months to build from start to completion. We hope our customers enjoy their new homes!



Family Housing on its way for Ballymena

Choice signed the Building Contract on 27th April 2016 to commence construction at Larne Road, Ballymena. This scheme will consist of 74 family houses with a mix of two and three bedroom houses and apartments. The family housing scheme will cost approximately $\pounds 6$ million to build and will be on site for 24 months.



New Supported Housing for Whiteabbey

Choice has recently begun construction for Abbotts Road, Whiteabbey, in partnership with the Northern Trust this supported housing scheme will provide 24 self-contained ground floor apartments for tenants with dementia. This supported housing scheme will allow for the promotion of greater independence amongst tenants whilst allowing for the provision of a high quality safe accessible service. The development cost is estimated at £3,300,000 and will be on site for 24 months.

Choice show support for Supporting People

Choice staff and Tenants' Forum members rallied together for positive change at Stormont in May to show their support for an immediate 10% increase in funding for Supporting People services to protect many of Northern Ireland's most vulnerable people.

Supporting People, a £74 million per annum Housing Executive programme, enables more than 20,000 vulnerable people to live as independently as possible. Beneficiaries include frail older people, homeless people and those with learning disabilities. People can receive support in a hostel, in sheltered housing or in other types of supported housing accommodation, as well as their own family homes.

Martin Meek, Supported Housing Manager spoke at the demonstration: "At Choice we have 44 supported housing partners in receipt of Supporting People funding. A 10% increase would make drastic changes to people's lives and help support people to live more independently within the community".

Welfare Reform in Northern Ireland

You will by now have received by post the Welfare Changes booklet from the Northern Ireland Executive, "Benefits are changing for people of working age – what you need to know..."

The booklet clearly outlines the Welfare Changes and what you need to know about; Personal Independent Payments, the Benefit Cap, Universal Credit, Employment and Support Allowance, Housing Benefit, Finance Support, Disputing a Social Security Benefit Decision, Sanctions, Consequences of Benefit Fraud and Direct Earnings Attachments.

You are advised to read the booklet carefully as the changes will affect the amount of benefit you receive and how your rent is paid.

Choice would like to assist and support tenants through the Welfare Reform changes in whatever way possible. However, in order to do so the Association needs to ensure its current records are up to date. Choice previously requested all tenants complete a 'Tenant Information Update' form and we appreciate and thank those who returned the completed form. However, we recognise further information is required from a number of tenants.



Therefore, over the coming weeks you may be contacted by Choice with a view to updating your information. We would be obliged if you could assist with this exercise. This process will enable the Association to identify those tenants that may be affected by Welfare Reform in order that we can offer support and assistance where possible.

Welfare Reform Drop-in Clinic

Choice Housing Officers recently attended a welfare reform clinic at Girdwood Community Hub alongside representatives from Advice NI,

Housing Rights and the social security agency to answer tenant questions in relation to the Welfare Reform changes.

Choice and Abbeyfield & Wesley working together to deliver supported housing

Choice work with more Joint Management Partners than any other housing association and we are proud that our partnerships provide affordable, purpose built housing options whilst offering continuous guidance and support.

We are pleased to announce that Abbeyfield & Wesley signed a Service Level Agreement (SLA) with Choice to manage a new supported living scheme for the frail and elderly at Hamilton Road, Bangor. This scheme comprises of seven ensuite bedrooms with communal facilities with daily support staff on site. Tenants will be moving into their new home at Hamilton Road over the coming weeks.

Abbeyfield & Wesley join over 40 partners currently working with Choice across many programmes of care and support including; learning disability, mental ill health, homelessness, addictions, frail elderly as well as Dementia, Autism, children leaving care and young mothers with babies. Abbeyfield & Wesley Housing Association was formed following the merger of Abbeyfield UK (NI) Ltd and Wesley Housing Association Ltd and they are a charity who provide high quality housing and care for older people.

Abbeyfield & Wesley has a range of housing options for older people which include:

- independent living for older people in sheltered housing with scheme supervisors;
- supported sheltered housing which has higher staffing levels and provision of meals; and
- residential care which is staffed 24 hours a day.

Martin Meek, Choice Supported Housing Manager commented on the new SLA: "Choice welcomes Abbeyfield & Wesley as a partner to deliver supported housing in the Bangor area. We are looking forward to welcoming tenants into their new homes".

We are delighted to be working in partnership with Choice Housing for the provision of a much needed supported, sheltered house in the Bangor area. Living in a supported, sheltered house can help prevent people becoming isolated and lonely. This house is family style in design and provides accommodation for seven older people. The residents can be independent, come and go as they please, have privacy in their own rooms, whilst at the same time have the knowledge that others are nearby so they are not alone and staff are there to provide support. A key feature in alleviating isolation is that home cooked meals, prepared by staff, are eaten together in the communal dining room.



In order to make paying your Rent and Service Charges both safe and easy, we offer a wide range of options that will mean you can choose how you pay.

You can now pay online

Ways to pay your rent



Going Online – You can now pay your rent online at www.choice-housing.org by clicking on 'Pay Rent' on the homepage.



The allpay App – You can pay your rent via the allpay App which is available to download from the Apple App or Windows Phone store and Google Play enabling you to pay your rent from your Apple, Windows or Android smartphone.



Direct Debit – You can set up a Direct Debit agreement. Please contact the Income Recovery Team on 0300 111 2211.



Phone us using your debit or credit card – You will need to give us your rent reference number (on your rent payment card), your debit or credit card details, and the amount you want to pay.



At any Post Office or shop or garage displaying the Paypoint sign – You can pay cash and show your rent payment card. Make sure you get a receipt and keep it safe.



Post – Send a cheque or postal order to our head office. Never send cash. You need to allow three days for your payment to reach us on time.

HousingExecutive

Housing Benefit direct payment – If you claim Housing Benefit, it can be paid directly into your rent account. However, if your Housing Benefit does not cover the full amount you still need to pay us the difference.



Choice Offices – You can pay with cash, cheque, or debit card. We accept MasterCard, Visa, Visa Electron, Solo and Switch.
